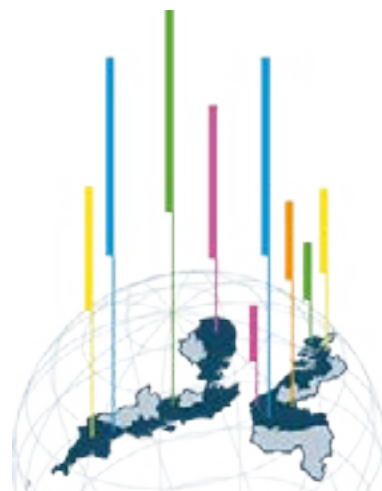

Until 2002 Betsan was a Senior Physiotherapist, working in the community and many of the patients she saw were demotivated. She felt we needed to take a step back from these people - they needed to develop an interest in social contact before there would be benefit from any medical intervention. 'Stitchlinks' is pioneering an exciting approach to healthcare. Their mission is to use knitting and other activities to improve wellbeing generally, but also to complement medical treatments in the self management of long-term illness.

6] Storytelling

By Stuart Packer. Stuart tells tales to "entertain, educate and enchant." Telling stories is a strong tool which can be used to connect with each other. It is suitable for all ages and different groups of patients and clients.

7] Listen and feel touched

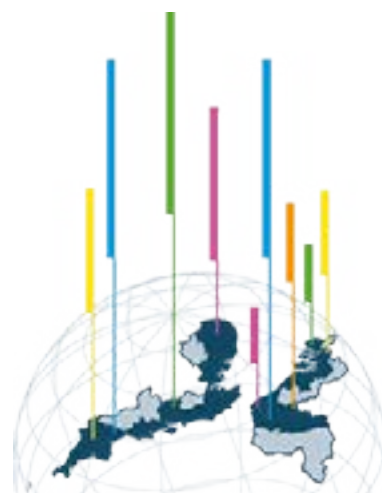
